

\$2.25 Million Capital Campaign

We estimate it will cost nearly \$2.25 million for the new construction and remodeling costs, upgrades of equipment and furniture, plus a 10% contingency. In order to proceed ahead with this important expansion, the original overall budget has been cut by about \$1.75 million to meet essential needs while keeping costs down in light of the current economic environment and its possible impact upon fundraising.

The Board has approved a comprehensive Capital Campaign plan to achieve these financial goals. The plan defines marketing, fundraising, staffing, and board goals which must be achieved for success. To ensure expenses do not get ahead of income, our plan lays out benchmarks to be achieved before each step is taken.

To better support Christian Science healing

In line with trends observed by Christian Science facilities around the country, Wide Horizon has transitioned into serving more guests who require lighter nursing care. To better serve this population, a major focus is to enhance programs and activities that strengthen the healing environment. This critical component will support programs designed to lead to regeneration, renewal, and spiritual growth, and encourage an expectation of healing and vibrancy. Guests have responded positively to newly introduced activities, with more planned once the expansion and remodeling are completed.

Construction

The new architectural design is by William Brummett Architects. This well-established firm, located in Denver, CO, has extensive experience, both nationally and locally, in designing nursing facilities within all pertinent state and local regulations, yet with homelike and/or "Green House" features.

Construction will take six to nine months to complete. Disruptions will be minimized during construction, and guests will be kept informed of the project's progress.

Facility improvements to meet these needs

This translates into facility changes which will serve a more active population through a more interactive environment that rouses dormant thought. This requires more open spaces for activities, more centralized services, and a more gracious dining room. Some facility modifications are desirable to provide more focused and secure services for so-called "confused" clients.

Over time, it has become clear that current facilities cannot meet these and other ongoing needs, and that the best way forward is to:

- Close down an increasingly older and dysfunctional South Building
- Replace elements lost with the closing of the old South Building
- Expand and improve the 20 plus years old North Building.

This plan will help ensure that Wide Horizon is able to provide Christian Science Nursing care and meet the healing needs of area Christian Scientists for many years to come.
