Executive Director's Report

In the words of Paul the Apostle, "Grace be to you and peace from God our Father, and from the Lord Jesus Christ." (II Cor. 1:2) Most of you know that Paul's trade prior to his ministry was as a tent maker, but most of you probably don't know that the German name Boettiger means "barrel maker" – though unlike Paul plying his trade I've never made a barrel. But I do extend a barrel of gratitude to each of you for your support of the Christian Science healing and nursing that occurs each day at Wide Horizon. Indeed, to continue its good works for future generations, Wide Horizon needs many folks such as you who value Christian Science nursing.

Wide Horizon has continued to make progress this past year, as in 2007 when Horizon House was so beautifully redecorated and the patio on the south of this building was

constructed, or in 2012 when the main building was extensively expanded and remodeled. Now, through your continued generosity, we're on the cusp of new construction of buildings for housing staff and for maintenance functions for our Progress at Wide Horizon Building Project. As mentioned in the call letter, since the membership meeting six months ago, we've learned that materials costs and labor rates in the construction industry are approximately 10-20% higher than three years ago and that this industry is "booming" again in Colorado, so the trades are scheduled out months in advance. We have made a few changes to the design concepts and negotiated some concessions from our contractor to complete this project within the approved budget of \$1,100,000. We anticipate the building permits from the City of Wheat Ridge

sometime in October. Construction therefore may be completed by the end of November and the demolition of the South Building should occur early in 2015.

Thank you all once again. And now we'll hear about the priceless activity of Christian Science nursing!

Director of Christian Science Nursing Report

Thanks for coming out today to show your interest in Christian Science healing. We're all interested in that, aren't we?

I could have said "Thanks for coming out to show your interest in Christian Science Nursing!" And, yes, I am going to talk about Christian Science nursing today—but Christian Science nursing and Christian Science healing aren't two separate things. They are inseparable. At first glance, it may appear that the Christian Science nurse is involved in caring merely for the physical needs of an individual who is relying on prayer for healing. However the real essence of Christian Science nursing is not what the nurse

is doing with her/his hands, but where their thought is. The Christian Science nurse is actively refuting the evidence of the material senses that say that man can be sick, weak, diseased, or somehow separated from God's love, and she is continually affirming the spiritual wholeness of man. This "taking a stand for the Truth" is what separates Christian Science nursing from the medical profession. It's what gives Christian Science nursing its healing power.

The metaphysical basis of the Christian Science Nurse is established forever in *The Manual of The Mother Church* where Mrs. Eddy lists as the first qualification for one representing

himself or herself as a Christian Science nurse "a demonstrable knowledge of Christian Science practice." Christian Science nurses are first and foremost metaphysicians.

I'd like to tell you about some of the healings we have had the privilege of witnessing at Wide Horizon this year. Healing is going on here every day in little and big ways.

- We have seen healings of dizziness and weakness and inability to eat.
- Mobility problems were overcome.
- Individuals walked again after a period of being confined to a chair.
- Chronic headaches have been healed.

- A person who had been having regular bouts of severe stomach pain and elimination problems had a complete healing in one day, as she reached out to God to see how she could love more and be more forgiving.
- Another person had had a fall and injured her hip. She'd been in bed for several months at home before she came to Wide Horizon, and things were continuing basically the same for her here. One day as she listened to the metaphysical readings broadcast over the speaker, she suddenly had the inspiration that she could sit herself up on the side of the bed—and that's just what she did! She took us all by surprise, doing this by herself! She told me she decided if she believed the things she was listening to, she'd better act like it! A week or two later (she was still staying in bed, though she had become more mobile) she noticed someone putting colorful balloons up in the trees outside her room. She wanted to know what was going on out there. The nurse suggested she get in a wheel chair just for a few minutes, as we were about to have a Fourth of July parade! We had children with decorated bicycles and wagons, staff members with their dogs, and Wide Horizon guests with red, white, and blue crepe paper on their walkers and wheel chairs. Who can resist a Fourth of July parade? We helped her into a wheel chair so she could watch. She had so much fun she joined the picnic after the parade and had her lunch outside with the

group. And she has been up in her wheel chair, celebrating her God-given freedom every day since then!

Well, we don't have parades every day. And you never know just what is going to inspire or spark someone's thought and lift them out of a mortal sense of limitation. But we do try to provide a nice balance of normal activity and spiritual inspiration for our guests each day.

So now I get to do my commercial: Christian Science Nursing is really good work! It blesses you at the same time you are blessing others. We hold introductory classes in Christian Science nursing from time-to-time as the opportunity presents itself. Talk to me, or one of the other nurses, if you would like to find out more about it. It might be the next step of unfoldment in your spiritual career.

We have an amazing group of Christian Science nurses here at Wide Horizon, for which I am grateful every day and grateful to be a part of this excellent team.

Now here is a bit about the services provided through Wide Horizon.

- Our primary service is "skilled" *Christian Science Nursing Care* in which we may be taking care of a person with a wound or someone who has had a fall or who may be having difficulty eating. Such skilled Christian Science nursing care may be eligible for Medicare coverage. Ask me for more details or check out our website about Medicare if you are

interested.

- We also have "light" *Christian Science Nursing Care* for those who just need a little help during their day—maybe help with getting dressed and bathed each day. These both occur right here in the main building.
- In Horizon House we provide *Supervised Residential Living* for individuals who want to be part of our community on an ongoing basis and can manage their personal needs on their own. We bring 3 delicious meals a day over to you and take care of all the housekeeping and laundry.
- We also have *Rest and Study for Spiritual Renewal* in Horizon House. There is hardly a day in the year when we don't have at least one room available, ready for you to come and enjoy a peaceful, inspiring time studying and reflecting. Don't put off what's most important! Make time for spiritual renewal this year.
- We have *Outpatient Services* if someone needs to have a wound cleaned and bandaged, a shower given—basically something that can be accomplished in an hour or so and then the person can return home.
- When a need can be better met at home, we can often help find a Christian Science nurse to visit you. And sometimes we can give suggestions over the phone to enable you to care for your family member on your own.

We are here in this community as a resource, so please feel free to give us a call and let us help whenever we can!

Treasurer's Report

Mrs. Eddy takes from Romans 8:28 when she writes "...we have the promise that 'all things work together for good to them that love God' - love good." (Message 1900 11:8)

Wide Horizon is grateful for the bounty of this past year.

The Church Manual outlines three numbers to be reported annually for The Mother Church (Art. XXIV). We are going to provide the same three numbers for Wide Horizon.

1. The amount of funds Wide Horizon had on hand at June 30th was \$4,600,000.
2. There is no indebtedness.
3. The operating expenses for the year totaled \$2,100,000.

The Board again set a contributions goal of \$500,000. We call it "A Wide Appeal." Wide Horizon received

enough in contributions to meet and exceed our goal. We were very fortunate to receive several significant gifts, including those from estate bequests, and from the Tenacre Foundation and Isabel Foundation. These gifts and yours make payment for the new construction project possible.

However, your contributions are still needed. Wide Horizon needs to raise approximately \$500,000 each year to meet operating expenses including our benevolence expenses. As you have just heard, we have developed relationships with various foundations and organizations, and are grateful to receive monies from them. However, contributions from you in the field are critical for us to meet our annual goal.

We are grateful to all our supporters who give so generously to Wide Horizon!

Promise to Give – *Desired and Useful Items*

Slips titled "Promise to Give" which listed desired and useful items were passed out at the annual meeting. These items included: Rosebush; Tree; Landscaping; Walking Path; Gazebo; HDTVs for Nurse Housing; Bobcat / Skid Steer. The latter item (approximately \$40,000 new) is much needed to do many projects on the grounds by our wonderful maintenance personnel. One point is that in order to stay within the budget for the Progress at Wide Horizon Building Project there is no provision for landscaping in the member-approved \$1.1M. Another point, after the South Building is razed, extensive landscaping work will be needed. Wide Horizon is fortunate to have maintenance staff that has the knowledge and desire to do most of the landscaping work around the property – including restoring the appearance of the land where construction and demolition will occur. With gifts to purchase trees and shrubs, our staff will prepare the ground and plant these items, particularly near the new housing and maintenance buildings. This is another way to help Wide Horizon!

Wide Horizon is a member of the Christian Science Provider Network (CSPN), which provided the following noteworthy information:

Health Plan Coverage of Christian Science

“It is not well to imagine that Jesus demonstrated the divine power to heal only for a select number or for a limited period of time, since to all mankind and in every hour, divine Love supplies all good.”

S&H 494:11

In light of changes in health insurance, the Christian Science Provider Network (Network) thought it would be helpful to explain some of the changes, why the Network was created, and invite your help as we continue to bring Christian Science care and treatment to humanity.

Health insurance has dramatically changed since the 1980’s when patients could choose individual health care providers and have their services covered by health plans. Currently the “managed care” health plan system involves networks of health care providers that contract with the health plan to provide health services for the health plan’s members.

After many years of research and prayer, it became evident that inclusion of Christian Science care and treatment in health plans would require the formation of a network. As a result the Christian Science Provider Network, a Massachusetts nonprofit corporation, was created in 2012 by The Mother Church as an independent nonprofit organization to facilitate health plan reimbursement of Christian Science services. The Network consists of independent contractor Christian Science Providers

(Christian Science practitioners, Christian Science nurses, and Christian Science nursing institutions). The Network is open to any Christian Science provider who meets objective criteria required by health plans. It does not cost anything to join the Network.

Presently, Christian Science practitioners, Christian Science nurses, and Christian Science nursing institutions – “Christian Science providers” – are frequently faced with caring for individuals who are insured with health plans. Now they are being required to become “credentialed providers” of health plans. They must bill the health plans (not the individual) using forms with codes. And finally, they must learn about co-pays, coinsurance and deductibles. This is a major paradigm shift that is only going to become more prevalent. The formation of the Network solves these issues by credentialing providers, billing electronically and resolving claims issues. In addition the Network contracts with health plans for coverage of Christian Science and performs other administrative functions. All of this is so Christian Science providers can focus on the healing practice. Finally, the Network is committed to honoring the sanctity and confidentiality of Christian Science practice.

How you can help

Health insurers need to hear from you that you want Christian Science to be a part of health plans. Ask your employer through your Human Relations Department to include Christian Science as a health benefit in your employment health benefit plan. Importantly, if your health plan is an Aetna health plan, Aetna has indicated that it will cover Christian Science in its large employer health plans (50+employees). Ask your employer that Christian Science health services be included as a benefit in your Aetna plan.
