"Editor-in-Chief" to indulge me in what I'd write regarding this issue. He said, "Yes!"


Many of you may have heard that I'll be leaving Wide Horizon June 30th to begin a new chapter of my professional and personal life. I fondly


It's been both a blessing and a privilege. That's all folks!


